5.1.1 Report On Capability Building and Skill Enhancement Initiative Adopted

The following programmes were conducted as part of enhancing skills in Academic, Technical, and Organisational aspects of the students at the institutional level.

I. Career and Personal Counselling

The following activities were conducted as part of 'career and personal counselling' and personal counselling for teacher trainees' capacity building and skill enhancement.

a. Beautiful Minds- A programme for Adolescents

A one-day career mentoring and motivational programme for adolescent children by St. Thomas College of Teacher Education, Pala and Civil Service Institute of Pala jointly organised a programme called 'Beautiful Minds' on 13.8.2022 and 12.10.22. The class was organised based on the theme 'Motivation and Mentoring: Exploring Special Talents and Capabilities'.. College Principal Dr. Sr. Beenamma Mathew, Dr. T.C. Thankachan (Vice-Principal), Dr. Alex George (Programme co-ordinator), Dr. V. V. Georgekutty (Principal of Civil Service Institute of Pala) and Dr. Baby Thomas (Vice-Prinipal of Civil Service Institute of Pala) were present in the meeting. The 48 teacher trainees' volunteers mentored and motivated the students. This was an important Capability Building and Skill Enhancement Initiative of St.Thomas College of Teacher Education, Pala.

b. Personal Guidance

Teachers have a job that goes beyond simply sharing information and helping students learn. Teachers are now being acknowledged not just as educators but also as mentors and advisors for their pupils. As part of their mentoring, the students delve into the necessity and importance of personal assistance. The subject matter include the principles of guiding, various forms of guidance, strategies for establishing a guidance centre at

educational institutions, and methods for arranging personal guidance. The abilities and traits of a teacher are crucial for teachers to foster the mental well-being of children and improve the educational experience.. In order to address personal issues and promote mental well-being, student teachers are offered guidance services by their mentors.

All the B.Ed. and M.Ed. students are divided into various groups and a teacher is allotted to each group to provide personal guidance. When a student faces a problem, they can consult their respective mentor for assistance. A separate mentoring file is maintained by the mentor teachers, which consists of personal information about their students, their strengths, weaknesses, special problems, and the measures taken.

c. Career Guidance & NET/SET/TET Coaching

The college initiates programmes to enable the students to qualify for competitive examinations, namely NET, SET, and TET, in collaboration with the Alumni Association. Coaching classes are arranged each year with the help of eminent resource persons. The alumni assovciation of the college plays an important role in the programme. The Alumni Association organised online coaching classes for NET, SET and K-TET between 17th August to 17th September 2021. The classes were attended by 245 aspirants from different parts of Kerala. The Association also organised online coaching classes for NET, SET and K-TET between 12 to 26 September 2022. 195 aspirants from different parts of Kerala participated in this coaching class. A lot of teacher trainees benefitted from the coaching classes provided by the college.

d. Guidance for Internship

Many teacher trainees need assistance for the successful conduct of various activities related to the teacher training programmes. It was observed during the internship that many student teachers lack the required knowledge about the preparation of teaching manuals and of teaching-learning materials. As part of capacity building and skill enhancement among the student teachers, rigorous and continuous personal guidance programmes were given by the subject teachers especially during micro-teaching sessions and preparation of discussion, demonstration, criticism and practice teaching classes.

II. Skill enhancement in Academic, Technical and Organisational aspects

The college has taken the utmost care in promoting a skill enhancement programme to equip the student teachers with the necessary skills. Mainly, skills related to three areas are given-acdemic, technical and organisational aspects.

a. Skill enhancement in Academic, aspects

• Capacity Building Programme on Climate Education and Curriculum Development-Bring Back Green (BBG)

A capacity-building programme on climate education and curriculum development was organised in the college from 16.2.2021 to 26.2.21. The programme was inaugurated by Ashish Kothari a well-known Indian environmentalist who is working on development, environment interface, biodiversity policy, and alternatives. 98 students have participated in the programme.

• Book Releasing in collaboration with Yuvashethra College Palakkad

The college has taken the initiative to collaborate with Yuvshekthra College Palakkad. In this collaboration, three books were edited and published. They are;

- 1. Global Indian Legacies Volume I
- 2. Global Indian Legacies Volume II
- 3. Best Place to Work- New Trends in Business Management

43 student teachers actively participated by contributing articles and engaging in various technical processes.

Communicative English Training

As communicative English is essential for teachers, the college has taken steps to introduce programmes for developing communicative competencies among student teachers.

Every year during the fourth semester, communicative English training was given to all the students by the English teachers of the college. This programme gives special focus on;

- a. Self-introduction for interviews
- b. Resume Preparation
- c. Extempore speech
- d. Grammar sessions for public service examinations

Micro Teaching Sessions

As part of teaching skill enhancement, all the students of the college were allowed to take classes on different microteaching skills in each class under the stewardship of class teachers in the first Semester of the course.

b. Skill Enhancement in Technical Aspects

• Bottle Art Design

The college organises value-added courses as part of the skill enhancement of student teachers. Bottle art designing is an important activity which develops artistic abilities among them. This provides students with a distinctive and innovative chance to discover and develop their artistic abilities. This course aims to instruct students in the nuances of converting ordinary bottles into exquisite works of art, with a focus on skills in painting, ornamentation, and design. By engaging in practical exercises and receiving expert instruction, students will cultivate their creativity, refine their creative abilities, and get an understanding of the significance of sustainable art methodologies. The course seeks to cultivate inventiveness, artistic discernment, and environmental awareness, rendering it a beneficial supplement to the educational programmes at the college. 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Vegetable Gardening

Vegetable gardening is another technical skill enhancement programme organised at the college. This activity involves selecting a site, planning the garden, preparing the soil, choosing the seeds and plants, planting a crop, and nurturing the plants until they are ready for harvest. The student-teachers enthusiastically contributed to the establishment of vegetable gardens, beautiful flower gardens, and the cleaning of the school

grounds during their vacation, making efficient use of their valuable time. Vegetable gardening was introduced in the nearby Govt. LP School, Arunapuram, Pala.

• Preparation of Blood Group Directory

The college engages in various social service activities. Donating blood to the needy is considered a major responsibility of student teachers to make the students aware of the importance of blood donation, Awareness programmes, blood donation camps, etc. are conducted under the auspicious of the Red Ribbon Club(RRC). A blood donation awareness programme was conducted on 17 October 2019 under the leadership of the RRC Unit as a part of National Blood Donation Day. 2018-2019

III. Communicating with persons of different disabilities: Braille, Sign language and Speech training

The college regularly organises programmes to interact with society especially with persons differently abled. Visit to special schools and other rehabilitation centers are arranged every year. The following are certain examples of such activities.

a. Special School Visit

The special education batch of 2021-2023 visited the 'Santhinilayam', a special school for mentally challenged children, located in Anthinad, a small village in Pala, on 11th March 2022, under the guidance of the teacher-in-charge, Dr. Alex George. Established in 1991, the school currently has over 200 students with various disabilities like learning disability, autism, and locomotory disability. Children are admitted based on the severity of their disability after a test conducted by the authorities. The school is managed by C.M.C sisters and follows a schedule from 10 AM to 4 PM. After lunch, students engage in co-curricular activities like dance, music, and vocational training in farming and tailoring. All teachers are qualified with a special B.Ed. course and provide individual attention to each student.

The teacher trainees distributed food, participated in cultural programs, and observed the school's facilities. They noted the increasing number of children with autism, possibly due to changing lifestyles. The school has produced medal-winning students in international competitions, showcasing their talents in dance, singing, and tailoring. The visit was an unforgettable experience, highlighting the dedication of teachers, the progress of students, and the hope in parents' eyes.

b. Interaction of Inmates of Mariasadanam Rehabilitation Center Pala

Mariyasadanam is a non-profit making, charitable organization promoted and managed by Santhosh Joseph in Palai, Kottayam District, Kerala State, India. It currently houses about 400+ destitute men, women and around 23 children of the inmates. The majority of Mariyasadanam's residents were either abandoned or left to fend for themselves by family members. The student teachers often visit the inmates, provide meals on all Wednesdays and provide financial support.

IV. Capability to develop a seminar paper and a research paper; understand/appreciate the difference between the two

a. Preparation and publication of research papers

Students of the college are guided to prepare and present research papers in seminars. They have published papers in seminar proceedings, journals. Workshop on journal article preparation with special reference to APA style

Dr. Lavina Dominic and Dr. Anju K. Paul, Assistant Professors at St. Thomas College of Teacher Education, Palai, led the workshop. It helped the students become acquainted with relevant writing skills and understand the way of academic writing.

V. E-content development

All the students were given training in developing E-content in their respective subjects by the class teachers during the first semester of B.Ed. Programme. The students were given ample opportunities to prepare and publish flip magazines. Students from various classes and clubs like Social Science, and English published flip magazines.

a. Video Editing

As part of Drama and Art Education in the frist semester B.Ed. Programme activities related to econtent is provided to equip the students with the 21st century skills in making beautiful videos.

As part of B.Ed. Programme in the first semester all the students are expected to create blogs and upload their works in their respective subjects.

- Provide B.Ed. students with an introduction to the notion of blogging and its instructional uses.
- Instruct on fundamental blogging platforms and tools.
- Acquire expertise in the development, editing, and dissemination of material.
- Promote introspective learning by engaging in blogging.
- Encourage the practice of collaborative blogging and the provision of peer feedback.

d. E-content development based on School subjects

All the B.Ed. students are required to prepare e-content based on their respective subjects. The prepared materials are then distributed to the practice teaching schools. The primary objective of e-content development at the B.Ed. level is to provide aspiring teachers with the necessary skills to become proficient digital educators who can effectively utilise technology to improve student learning outcomes. Through participation in e-content production, B.Ed. students have the following benefits.

Improve teaching abilities: Acquire a thorough comprehension of instructional design ideas, learning theories, and the use of technology to aid in the process of learning.

Enhance proficiency in using digital technologies: Develop expertise in utilising diverse digital tools and platforms to create, edit, and distribute material

Promote creativity and innovation: Investigate novel approaches to provide instructional material using multimedia components, interactive exercises, and captivating forms.

Cultivate and enhance the ability to think critically and solve problems: Assess the requirements of the learners, choose suitable material, and create impactful learning opportunities.

Foster a culture of cooperative learning: Collaborate in teams to create electronic material, promoting cooperation and receiving feedback from peers.

Get ready for the online learning environment: Create a collection of electronic content resources to assist in teaching and learning within a technologically advanced setting.

Participate in open educational resources: Generate and distribute exceptional e-content to support the broader educational community.
