






#### RED RIBBON CLUB






#### PROF. N. J. JOSEPH ENDOWMENT LECTURE

#### SILENT PROTEST AGAINST DRUGS - A RALLY AGAINST DRUGS

'Vimukthi' (Kerala State Mission for De-addiction) is a project launched by the State Government to conduct awareness campaigns against alcoholism and drug abuse. It has been implemented with the help of Student Police Cadets, anti-addiction clubs of schools and colleges and various other student, youth and women's organisations. State wide campaigns to make students and youth aware of the evils of drug addiction and alcoholism are conducted by the mission with the aim of 'Addiction free Kerala'. As part of this mission, the Vimukthi Club of St. Thomas College of Teacher Education, Pala organised a one-act play and awareness class by Janamaithri police on January 17th, 2020. The program was successful in conscientizing the teacher trainees about the evils of drug addiction. The initiative, 'Silent Protest Against Drugs' was an offshoot of this awareness. The programme fanned its wings with the guidance and support of principal, Rev. Dr. (Sr). Celine Joseph and under the directorship of Dr. Alex George, teacher in charge of Vimukthi Club.

The flag off ceremony was conducted in the college auditorium by the principal, Rev. Dr. (Sr). Celine Joseph at 3.30 pm. The meeting was attended by the police officers from the Excise Department, Pala, media persons, teaching and non-teaching staff of St. Thomas College of Teacher Education, Pala. 48 students participated in the silent protest rally and 5 faculty participated in the programme. It was followed by the oath taking and rally. The message to the society was successfully conveyed through placards and various theme-based programs like flash mob, street play and group song which were enacted by the students at the main spots throughout the rally.









#### ANTI -RAGGING AWARENESS PROGRAMME-SKIT AND SCREENING OF VIDEOS ON RAGGING AS PER UGC ORDERS

The Anti-Ragging Awareness Programme was conducted on 11<sup>th</sup> November 2019 at St. Thomas College of Teacher Education, Pala, in compliance with UGC regulations.
