Ignite the waste using a fire source. Close the chamber's lid. Use an air pump to enhance burning. The most commonly used plastics polyethene, PET etc are made up of only carbon and hydrogen, it undergoes incomplete combustion to liberate carbon dioxide and water. The liberated carbon dioxide is absorbed by soda lime. The soda lime is placed in the space inside the lid such that the absorbent is exposed to the poisonous gases and carbon dioxide liberated. It changes its colour from white to pink on reaching carbon dioxide absorption capacity. Absorbent is replaceable.

The idea is to digitalize the Student Concession Card and make it a Smart Student Card. This project mainly focuses on the students who depend on private buses for transportation. Smart Student Card contains the details which clarifies the eligibility of the student to avail concession in bus. It has a facility similar to wheels on card which helps the student to make pre-payment of a sum of money. On each usage the concerned concession amount gets deducted from the main balance while swiping in the ticket machine by the conductor. Students need not carry coins. This process makes the card more authentic and avoid manipulation.

#### 6. BEAUTIFUL MINDS

St. Thomas College of Teacher Education, Pala, in collaboration with the Civil Service Institute of Pala, successfully orchestrated the 'Beautiful Minds' program. 

## Anti-Drug Campaign -report



## Distribution of Anti-Drug Leaflets in Houses

As part of the Anti-Drug Mission conducted by the Vimukthi Club and NSS Unit (90 B) of St. Thomas College of Teacher Education Pala, I visited 10 houses in my neighbourhood in Bharananganam on 25<sup>th</sup> and 26<sup>th</sup> of December 2022. I distributed the leaflets containing the message against the use of drugs and alcohol and asked their opinions on preventing people from using them.

Several opinions were shared by the people on the ways to stop the use of drugs and alcohol. They opined that awareness classes should be conducted among people especially youth to educate them on the dangerous consequences of the use of such substances. People should have self-respect and they should take the decision to not be addicted to such hazardous habits. So many people consider using liquor and drugs as part of their pride and masculinity. People should bring about a change in their attitude regarding the use of liquor and drugs.

Government should completely ban the distribution of liquor and drugs. The various beverage outlets opened by the government should be closed. They are contrary to the campaigns and rallies conducted by the government. Strict action should be taken against people who distribute drugs. Many people are of the

opinion that there is no needed enthusiasm among the police to track and arrest such people. Some of the officers are part of the mafia that distribute drugs. So corruption should be removed from the Police Department. People are afraid of complaining against the people who use drugs as it causes risks to their lives. The police should strongly support and protect people who report such cases. It would be good if there is a helpline number to report such cases.

They also opined that Anti-Drug campaign should start from homes. Parents should have proper control over their children and should monitor their activities and friendships. Parents should not use liquor and drugs and should discourage their children from using them and make them aware of the consequences. The bags of children should be checked in schools, churches, etc. The police should help in such tracking of drug carriers. Parents, teachers and other authorities should become more vigilant.

It was a good experience visiting houses to spread the message of Anti-Drug Mission. People are supportive of this mission and stand together against the use of alcohol and drugs.



## 8. VALUE EDUCATION LESSON PLANS

During an IQAC meeting, one innovative idea emerged: to craft value education lesson plans for classes 5 to 9, spearheaded by the teacher overseeing value education, particularly for integration into internship programs. This proposal gained commendation, and the responsibility for developing these plans was entrusted to Dr. T.C Thankachan, the teacher in charge. Drawing from curriculum objectives and student assessments, pertinent topics and themes were identified for the lesson plans. Subsequently, a range of effective teaching strategies such as discussions, role-plays, case studies, storytelling, multimedia presentations, and experiential activities were selected to ensure student engagement. Leveraging these strategies alongside the chosen topics, comprehensive lesson plans were meticulously drafted for each session by the faculty member. During internships, guidance and assistance were provided to students to facilitate the implementation of these plans. Flexibility was encouraged, allowing students to adapt the plans to suit the needs of their learners effectively. Value education lesson plans were developed for classes 5, 6, and 7 during the academic year 2020-21, while lesson plans for classes 8 and 9 were crafted in the subsequent academic year, 2021-22.





## MATHA-PITHA-GURU-DEIVAM

### MODELS AND CREATORS ON EARTH

"Matha Pitha Guru Deivam" is a very popular adage or phrase in Sanskrit language and often quoted in Hinduism. Translated word for word, it is, "Mother father Teacher God". The meaning of this adage is the greatest truth, and is the order in which one should offer reverence. The phrase is a basic tenet in existence from the time of the Vedas and beyond and represents the hierarchy in which one should respect these entities.

First comes the mother (Matha or Mata) who gives birth to the child, thereby bringing us as a child into this world. Next comes the Father (Pitha or Pita), because it is the mother who knows the truth about the father and she points us to the father. The mother and father then takes us to the teacher (Guru), and it is the guru, through his or her teaching points us to God (Deivam or Devam). Here god represents the consciousness or self awareness or our real self.

It is the mother that nourishes you in her womb. She breaths for you and takes the oxygen in her blood to the womb to create and develop your organs and enable you to living though immersed in a pool of liquid that keeps your tissues safe and growing. She eats for you, she breaths for you. She suffers discomfort for 290 days for you. Bearing your weight in her womb. No one does that much for you in your entire life. So she as your creator and comes first. Your father gives all the comforts to your mother and provides for all her comforts and for your healthy growth in the womb of your mother. He is responsible for keeping your mother happy and peaceful thus helping psychologically to mould your mind and character in the womb itself.

Your brain is like a processing unit and hard disc of a computer. Your mother installs the initial basic operating system in your brain so that you know how to suck her breast for milk after you are born. So your father who provides for you everything like food clothing, toys and schooling etc comes second. Your father takes you to school and pays for your education. He comes into your life after your mother.

The teacher (the guru) is supposed to play a role model to you and teach all that is necessary to develop your knowledge and improve Your personality and make you a worthy citizen and good member of the society. You come to know of him only after you come to know your father. It is the teacher that imparts the knowledge you need for your life and tells you about God, his creations and his importance in your life. So you come to know of God only after your teacher.

These four are said to be your four Gods in the respective order. So Mother, father and the guru are considered to be more important as God himself.

There are umpteen number of stories where devote sons have disobeyed the Gods respectfully while they were attending to their parents and the Gods have only admired them. In fact the Gods were powerless before such children. So also, the Gods and the powerful saints whom even the Gods feared were powerless before the wives who were devoted to their husbands. Stories like that were meant to convey to people, the power of devotion to the parents and husbands.

All religions teach us to respect and love our parents. Innocent inquiries, comments, directions, remarks or requests of our aged parents should not infuriate us.

The Holy Quran teaches us, "Your Lord has decreed: Do not worship any but Him; Be kind to your parents; and should both or any one of them attain old age in your life, do not say to them a word of contempt, nor repel them, but speak to them with respect and be humble and tender to them and say, "Lord, show mercy to them as they nurtured me when I was small" {Holy Quran, Chapter 17 (AL-ISRA) verses 23-24}.

The "Taittiriya Upanishad", a Sacred Hindu Scripture, teaches, "Matru devo Bhava, Pitru devo Bhava, Acharya devo Bhava, Atithi devo Bhava" advocating to honour one's mother, father, teacher and guest as God. This is repeated in the popular axiom in Indian culture, "Matha, Pitha, Guru Deivam." which urges a child to treat his mother, father and teacher as equal to God and give due respect and reverence to the three persons who lead us to God.


# 12.SEMINARS AND WEBINARS BY THE COLLEGE IN COLLABORATION WITH MOU INSTITUTIONS




# An Online Capacity Building Programme on Climate Education and Curricular Development 16 to 26 February 2021

Here "Yuvakshetra" represents the gathering place of young people where they are moulded by professionalism, discipline and holistic development. 




### 15.TRAINING PROGRAMME FOR FACULTY
