
PRILIMINARY DISCUSSION


ORIENTATION PROGRAMME





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

The idea is to digitalize the Student Concession Card and make it a Smart Student Card. This project mainly focuses on the students who depend private buses transportation. Smart Student Card contains the details which clarifies the eligibility of the student to avail concession in bus. On each usage concerned concession amount gets deducted from the main balance while swiping in the ticket machine by the conductor. Students need not carry coins. This process makes the card more authentic and avoid manipulation.
