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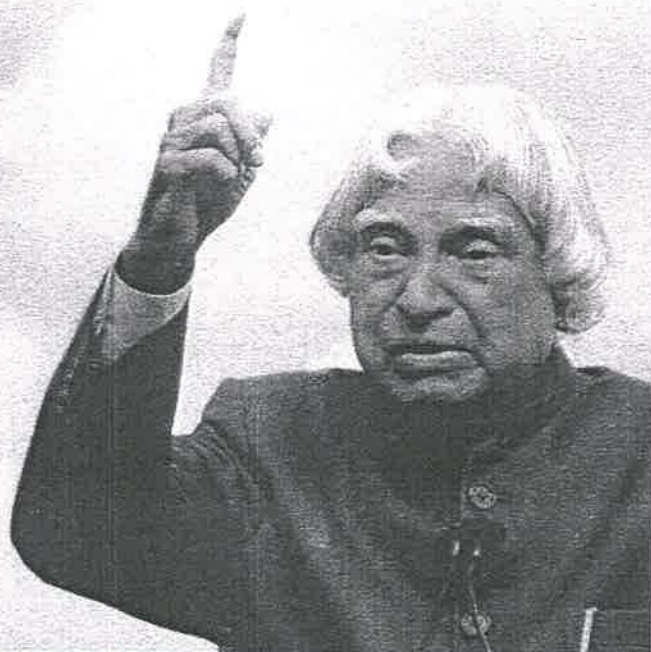
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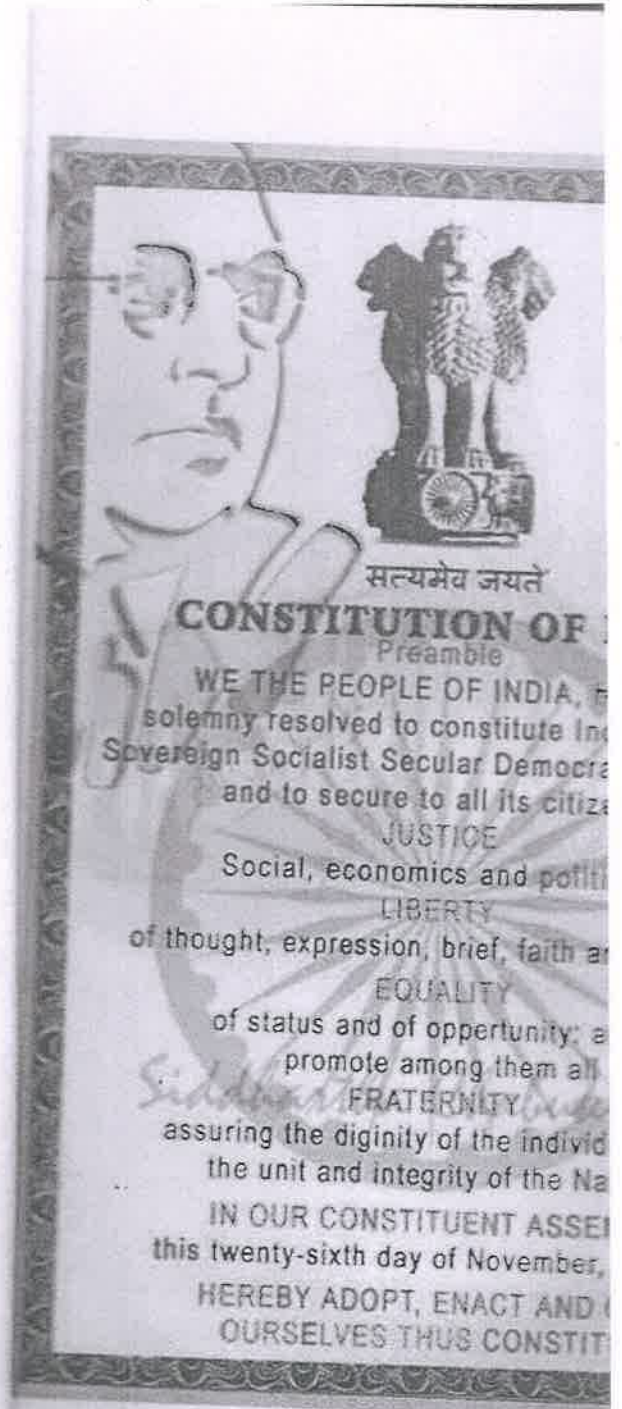
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About the College

During this period, he did his Masters in English Language and Literature both from Madurai Kamaraj University and Bharathiar University.
