

REPORT OF YOUNG INNOVATORS PROGRAMME (2021-2023)

The Young Innovators Programme, a specialized initiative by the Kerala Development and Innovative Strategic Council (K-DISC), endeavors to empower budding innovators to devise novel products, services, or models that address evolving societal demands, unmet needs, or current market gaps through innovative challenges. The college actively promotes student engagement in this program, encouraging them to showcase inventive concepts. The students of 2021- 2023 batch under the guidance of Dr. Alex George initiated innovative ideas. The team consisted of 10 groups with 4 or 5 members. The poster of 10 groups are given below and each team presented 10 innovative ideas.

INNOVATIVE IDEAS GIVEN BY (2021-2023 Batch)


- 1. An air-tight stainless steel incinerator designed for plastic waste disposal
- A dual-purpose solution for tourists: a hearth for cooking with a metallic tray
 equipped with thermoelectric plates to generate electricity, connected to a voltage
 regulator for safe charging of mobile phones
- 3. Introducing fingerprint machines in banking systems
- 4. "Daily Assessment Learning" is an app that allows students to upload assignments and connect with local subject experts for mentorship.
- 5. The proposed idea integrates public and private ambulances into a single app, allowing users to quickly and efficiently access emergency services by consolidating ambulance data and linking facilities to hospitals.
- 6. To establish ladies-friendly toilets in public transport, a compact toilet and wash area similar to those found in airplanes and trains can be installed at the end of the bus, requiring adjustments to seating and height while ensuring proper waste disposal.
- 7. The proposed idea aims to manage food waste from hotels by developing an app that connects farmers with hotels, enabling the scheduling of pickups for food waste conversion into compost and bio-gas, thereby reducing waste and benefiting the agricultural sector.
- 8. A self-scanning system enables shoppers to scan items into their virtual cart using a smartphone app, pay at the end, and exit the store quickly, providing a more convenient and efficient shopping experience while reducing checkout lines
- 9. The proposed platform aims to enhance farmers' entrepreneurial skills by providing an online and offline platform for selling various products across three zonal levels, connecting farmers with local beneficiaries, regular customers, and large-scale markets, thereby maintaining their identity and increasing entrepreneurial opportunities. T
- 10. The proposed electronic book features interactive elements, including audio, visuals, and writing capabilities, to provide an immersive and engaging learning experience for users.

These innovative ideas of ten teams were presented in the district level and from them two teams were selected to the state level competition. Each team got a cash award of Rs 25000 and each member of the team received Rs 5000. These two teams

RESEARCH CENTRE INAUGURATION


St. Thomas College of Teacher Education, Pala, achieved a significant milestone by securing recognition as a Research Center in Education under Mahatma Gandhi University on November 3, 2022. All the faculty and students of B.Ed. and M.Ed. witnessed the event. The Research Center was formally inaugurated on November 23, 2022, following a rigorous inspection by a university expert team on August 27, 2022. The college successfully initiated the coursework for its first batch of Ph.D. aspirants on March 1, 2023, marking a pivotal step towards fostering a robust research culture. To further enrich the academic environment, seven faculty members, including the College Librarian, successfully completed their Ph.D. theses, which were unveiled at the Research Center's inauguration ceremony.





SCERT-RESEARCH CONSULTANCY SERVICE

St. Thomas College of Teacher Education, Pala, has been actively engaged in research consultancy services. Demonstrating its expertise, the college hosted a 'Tool Preparation Workshop' on June 18, 2022, for an SCERT-sponsored Kerala project focused on developing aesthetics-based theatrical instructional packages. 4 teachers were included in the program. The workshop featured the resource persons, Dheeraj Augustine (HST), St Agnes H.S. Muttuchira and Rajeev Joseph (HST), St Thomas H.S. Erumely, showcasing the college's commitment to providing valuable consultancy and support for educational research initiatives.

SAMAGRA SAKSHARA PALA PROJECT

On July 26, 2022, the college hosted the official launch of the Kerala Government's Samagra Sakshara Pala project. In this event, the decision to revise and reprint the Malayalam alphabet in SCERT language textbook was officially declared by the Honourable Education Minister V Shivankutty.

As a significant contributor to the project, the college actively participated through student involvement in internship and extension programs like Nirakoot, demonstrating its commitment to the initiative's goals. The faculty and students of B.Ed and M.Ed participated in the program along with headmasters and principals from schools under education corporate agency of diocese of Pala. There were 16 teachers and 110 students as participants. The D.E.O and A.E.Os of Kottayam District were also present. The college supported the Mathrubhasha Poshaka Sannadha Samithi in their research to enhance the learning of the mother tongue by painting Malayalam alphabets on the walls of their research schools.



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BEAUTIFUL MINDS




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PENALTY SHOOTOUT COMPETITION

FACULTY EXCHANGE PROGRAMME WITH MOU PARTNER



UGC NET, SET, K-TET COACHING




MEGA BLOOD DONATION CAMP


WORKSHOP ON PREPARATION OF TEACHING AIDS








ORANGE THE WORLD CAMPAIGN


WOMEN'S CELL

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





SPARSHAM PHASE II

FELICITATION OF Ph.D. AWARDEE - Dr. SUNIL THOMAS







INTERNATIONAL FACULTY SHARING



NATIONAL EDUCATION POLICY 2020 - CONCERNS AND CHALLENGES






Teachers and students (seniors and juniors of B.Ed.) contributed to fund raising. These collected funds were directly transferred to the flood victims.


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HARNESSING OF LOCAL RESOURCES - SHALABAM




VENUE FOR GOVERNMENT PROGRAMMES






THREE-DAY NATIONAL WORKSHOP


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SCIENCE DAY CELEBRATIONS

The college follows the Green Protocol measures such as avoiding the use of all types of disposables (including plastic and paper) in daily life, always using cups and containers that can be washed and reused, and always avoiding the use of plastic materials, thereby following the government rules in this regard, segregating bio and non-biodegradable waste materials, composting biodegradable at source using simple and appropriate composting devices, keeping the non-biodegradable clean and dry and storing them separately based on the various types, avoiding the 'use and throw' carry bags, always using bags made of eco-friendly materials, using cloth banners instead of flex, using eco-friendly materials like leaves and flowers for decoration and while making bouquets for felicitating guests etc.

St. Thomas College of Teacher Education's Green Protocol Samithi took the initiative to organise a classroom cleaning program on March 8th, 2022. The program saw enthusiastic participation from all students and faculty, who focused on collecting and responsibly disposing of waste. This resulted in a cleaner and more eco-friendly learning environment for everyone. 50 students 10 faculty participated in the programme.





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




NIRAKOOT DAY 3 - PAINTING THE WALLS OF ST. THOMAS HSS PALA





NIRAKOOT DAY 4- PAINTING THE WALLS OF AIDED LPS MEENACHIL










NIRAKOOT DAY 8-PAINTING THE WALLS OF ST. THOMAS HSS PALA






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
NIRAKOOT DAY 9 - PAINTING THE WALLS OF GOVT. NEW LPS PULIYANNOOR






NIRAKOOT 14 - PAINTING THE WALLS OF ST. ANTONYS HS VELLIKULAM







REPORT ON DIVERSITIES IN THE SCHOOL SYSTEM



MoU WITH ST. JOSEPH'S COLLEGE OF EDUCATION, MYSURU










WEBINAR ON NATIONAL EDUCATION POLICY 2020: CHALLENGES AND CONCERNS




ONLINE CAPACITY BUILDING PROGRAM ON CLIMATE EDUCATION AND CURRICULUM DEVELOPMENT








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
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ELECTORAL LITERACY CLUB National Voters' Day




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YOUTH EMPOWERMENT PROGRAMME - SEMINAR ON 'NEW GENERATION' TEACHERS'

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MoU WITH YUVAKSHETRA INSTITUTE OF MANAGEMENT STUDIES, PALAKKAD








ONE DAY WEBINAR ON SWAMI VIVEKANANDA: A VISIONARY OF INDIAN EDUCATION








WEBINAR ON CANCER AWARENESS




VALUE-ADDED COURSES - ONLINE ASSESSMENT TOOLS, MEDIA AND INFORMATION LITERACY





TRAINING PROGRAM FOR THE IMPLEMENTATION OF LMS AND MIS










RED RIBBON CLUB






PROF. N. J. JOSEPH ENDOWMENT LECTURE

The film also features two well-known Bollywood actors Asif Basra and Taranjit Kaur.

Set in the beautiful Kullu valley of Himachal Pradesh, Saanjh follows the journey of Sanju, a 16-year-old city girl who becomes the victim of bogus social-media posts. When her father discovers a compromising online video in which Sanju supposedly features, he consigns her to their remote ancestral village to stay with her grandmother. Isolated and dejected, Sanju encounters ill-mannered house guest Jonga and finds surprising solace in his company. 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


